It has been great to find the church growing in so many places, and he enjoys working closely with the Bishop of Woolwich, Michael Ipgrave and Archdeacon Jane Steen; but being 'venerable' still feels strange, as does being in an office most of the week, and at different churches each weekend, with differing responsibilities.


