Alternatively, you can buy tickets at The Nave, Monday - Friday 10.00am - 2.00pm and for half an hour before evening performances.

You can reserve tickets for any event on Uxbridge 31333. Tickets will be held at The Nave for three days, pending receipt of payment by post or in person.

Concessions are generally available to children under 16, students, UB40s and senior citizens. Proof of status may be required.

Discounts for parties of 10 or more may be negotiated - please ring Uxbridge 59942.

Tickets may not be exchanged nor money refunded except in the event of cancellation.

DIRECTIONS

The Nave is less than a minute's walk from Uxbridge Tube Station (Metropolitan & Piccadilly) and Uxbridge Bus Station (Routes U1, U2, U3, U4, U5, 58, 128, 207, 222, 223, 305, 325, 347, 348, 443 and 458).

Ample parking is available in the Cedars and Grainges car parks behind the Pavilions, which are both accessible from Oxford Road. Limited free parking is available in Windsor Street after 6.30pm.
