The Nave is the weekday identity of St Margaret's, the ancient church at the top of Windsor Street, between the Pavilions and the Tube. All proceeds from the sale of tickets are ploughed back into the programme. The finances of The Nave are entirely separate from those of the church. St Margaret's remains a centre for public worship and private prayer, as it has been since the 13th century. For details of services, please see the church noticeboard. A short service of Holy Communion will be held in the Chapel every Friday at 12.30pm. If you would like to talk to a member of the clergy, someone will be available after Holy Communion every Friday, from 1.00pm - 2.00pm.

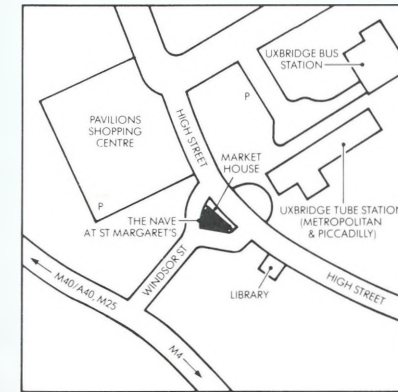
## TICKETS

Tickets may be reserved by telephone on Uxbridge 59942 up to three days in advance. They will be held at the Box Office for three days only, pending receipt of payment by post or in person. A discount of £1 off the advertised price is generally available for children under 16, UB40s and senior citizens. Proof of status may be required. Discounts for parties of 10 or more may be negotiated. Please ring Uxbridge 59942. Tickets may not be exchanged nor money refunded except in the event of cancellation.

The Nave is less than a minute's walk from Uxbridge Underground Station (Metropolitan & Piccadilly) and the Uxbridge Bus Garage (Routes 58, 98, 128, 204, 207, 222, 223, 224, 290, 305, 325, 347, 348, 443, 458 and 733).

Ample parking is available in the Cedars and Grainges car parks behind the Pavilions, which are both accessible from Oxford Road. Limited free parking is available in Windsor Street after 6.30pm.
