Discounts for parties of 10 or more may be negotiated – please ring 0895 812193. Tickets may not be exchanged nor money refunded except in the event of cancellation.


DIRECTIONS

The Nave is less than a minute's walk from Uxbridge Tube Station (Metropolitan & Piccadilly) and Uxbridge Bus Station (Routes U1, U2, U3, U4, U5, 58, 128, 207, 222, 223, 305, 325, 347, 348, 443 and 458).


