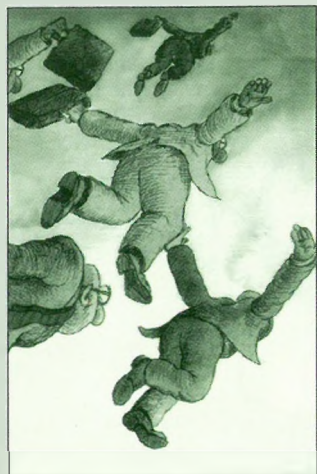


FEBRUARY

Wednesday 10th 8.00pm Level 5 Theatre Company Forging Rembrandt

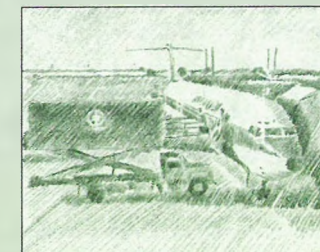

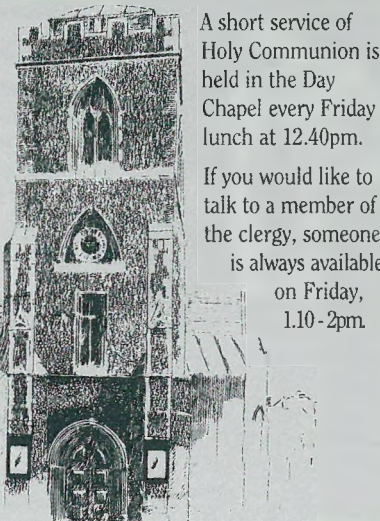

Concessions are available for children under 16, students, UB40s and senior citizens. Proof of status may be required.

We regret that children under 5 cannot be admitted to events at The Nave.

Directions

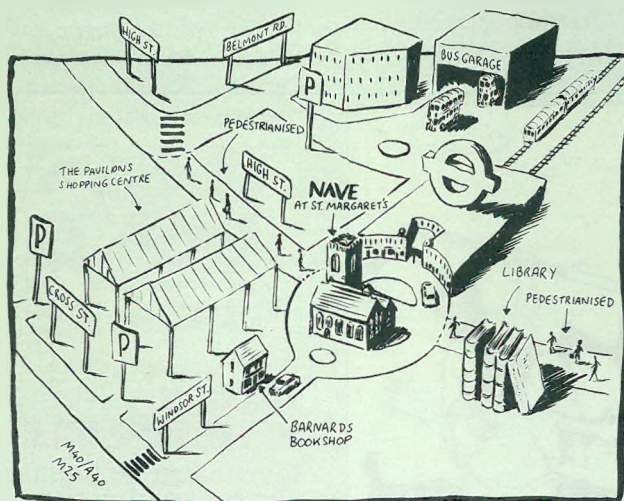
