



Directions

The Nave is quickly and easily accessible from central London. It is a minute's walk from the Uxbridge Tube and Bus Stations. Off-street 'Pay and Display' parking is available at the Cedars and Grainges car parks off Oxford Road. There is limited free parking in Windsor Street after 6.30pm.
